- ❖ Organizing Hausla- Fight against Cancer is an annual cultural shows (fashion, dance, play etc) organized with cancer survivors from all over India intending to emphasize the power of confidence and the courage to survive cancer at all stages.
- ❖ Door to door awareness campaign in rural area through household visit, print & electronic media, cancer related mobile app, public announcement and road show etc
- ❖ Organizing various conferences on the issue alternative approaches to make our life healthier i.e. Health & Wellness Festival
- ❖ Better utilization of Sneh Mobile app on cancer which help in knowing all important aspects of cancer and also fulfill the related other queries.

B. Mid Term Strategies:

- ❖ Continuous advocating with the all-state Governors, Chief Ministers, Education Ministers and top bureaucrats to adding chapter on Cancer awareness in the syllabus of 8-12 classes. Also to develop 3-4 pages materials for chapter.

❖ Cancer Detection Services such as State of the art Mobile Vans/ Cancer Detection Camps & Regular Cancer Detection Camps in Bihar, Odisha and Delhi NCR

❖ Establishing Sneh Health & wellness centre and Hospital (Already started in Ghaziabad, (Delhi/NCR) and Durgapur (West Bengal); and proposed to start in Kishanganj (Bihar), Bhubaneswar (Odisha), Ranchi (Jharkhand).

❖ Establishing well-equipped cancer awareness, early detection and counseling centre in Bihar, Odisha. Thereafter, it shall be implemented in other states also. The cancer detection centre help us in serve the rural population as well as urban.

❖ Establishing Pathological Diagnostic Centre(s).

❖ A systematic route plan develops for the movement of vans to detect the cancer in rural areas.

❖ One time mass level screening of the women who bearing age from 25 to 60 years in rural areas of Bihar and other states will be carried out.

C. Long Term Strategies:

❖ Establishing state of the art state diagnostic and Cancer curative centre, which help cancer-suffering patients to get all type of qualitative treatments, without any payment (Cashless). It's may be operative through insurance policy or any other approaches which decided later.

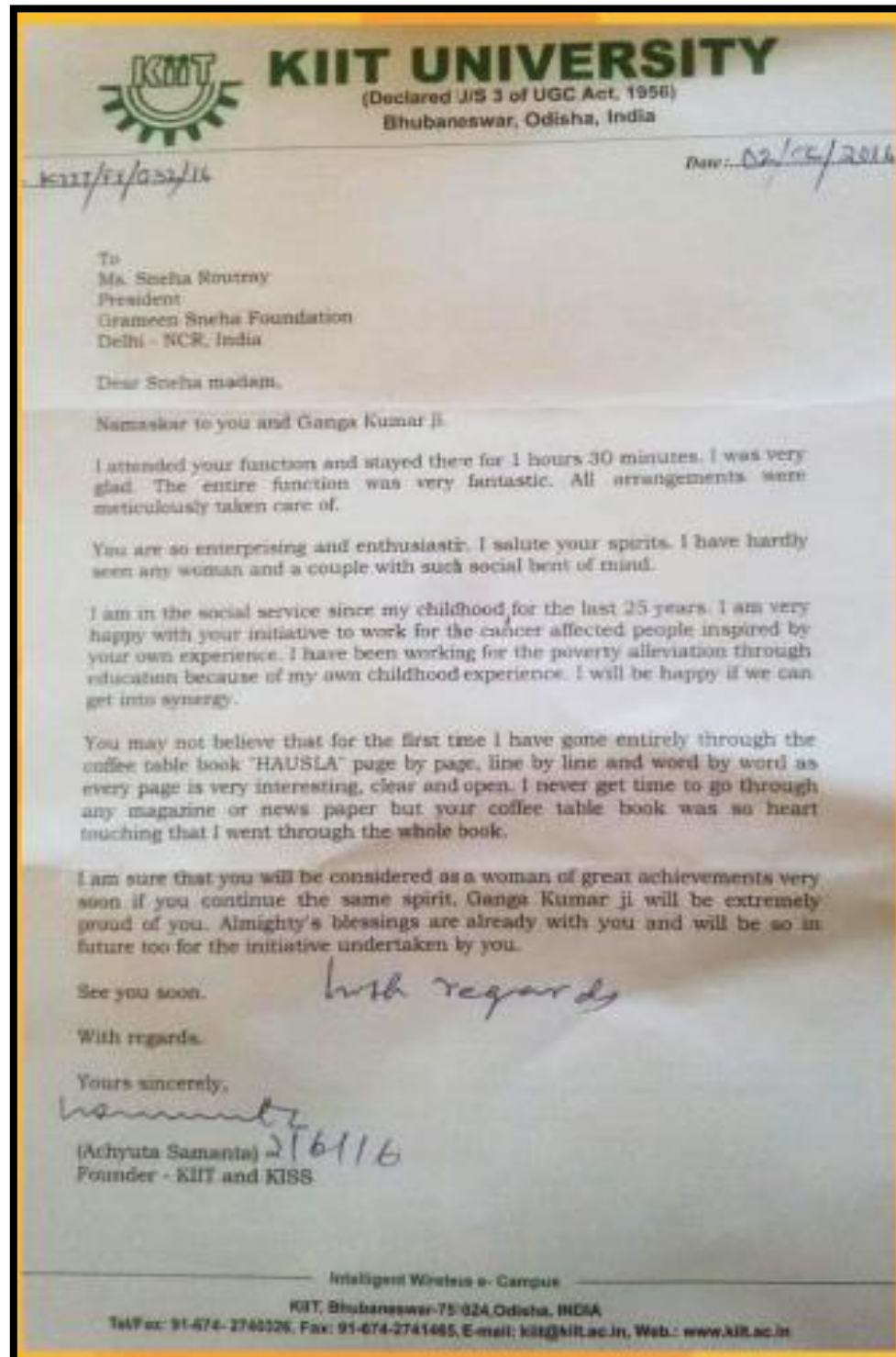

Their programme is developed on the basis of priori information of the participants, viz. demographics, claims history, and proprietary data-management. This helps the Doctors to detect and treat some cancers in its early phase of evolution.

Besides, GSF's team identifies those participants who have not completed their target activity. Target activities consist of preventative cancer screenings, as appropriate for specific age and gender populations based on national health guidelines. Foundation's Cancer Awareness team explains the importance and benefits of the target activity to the participants.

I, have personally witnessed some of their screening activities/awareness campaigns at one of their centres and was thoroughly impressed with their sheer professionalism, sensitivity and detailing. Their campaigns have had quite and effective change to the locality they work.

Longest distance covered for awareness – gearless bicycle – group

Grameen Sneh Foundation, Dwarka, New Delhi, organized and supported a cycle ride by four people across five states and 14 districts to create awareness about cancer. Led by retired Havildar K. Ganjanam of Army Air Defence and accompanied by an ambulance, the cyclists – Kumar Aman, Premjeet Singh and Vicky Kumar – covered a distance of 1,561.4 km in 23 days from 2–25 December 2018. They started from Gopalpur, Odisha, and travelled through Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Maharashtra, ending their journey in Pune, Maharashtra. En route they interacted with students from 46 schools and colleges, and communities in over 100,000 villages.

name of Madhubani Paintings (Madhubani Art) is a style of painting practiced in the Mithila region of Bihar most predominant in the Madhubani District of Bihar where from it originated. Madhubani Painting(s) were traditionally created by the women of various communities in the Mithila region. Madhubani is also a major export center of these paintings. This painting as a form of wall art was practiced widely throughout the region; the more recent development of painting on paper and canvas mainly originated among the villages around Madhubani, and it is these latter developments that led to the term "Madhubani Art" being used alongside "Mithila Painting."

GSF organizes Painting competitions under the initiative Bihar; Ek Virasat in which college and school students (male as well as female) enthusiastically participate. Indian art in general and Madhubani Paintings in particular deserve international acclaim for which honing the young talent and keeping the art alive is must and in this direction GSF gives away awards, rewards and appreciations to the best performers. There is ritual content for particular occasions, like birth or marriage, and festivals, such as Holi, Kali Puja and Durga Puja.

Introduction:

The Constitution and Articles of Association that define the rules for Grameen Sneh Foundation allows operations and activities in versatile fields viz; Healthcare, Education & Skill Development, Art & Culture, Livelihood Empowerment, Relief & Rehabilitation and despite all Healthcare has always been a priority for GSFians. In the challenging situation created in 2020 and thereafter by the COVID-19 Pandemic & Lockdown it was decided to put a halt on all the ongoing activities and divert the manpower from all chapters viz GSF Management, Staff, Volunteers towards Relief & Rehabilitation of Victims of COVID-19 & Lockdown thereof.

Soon after the announcement of Nationwide Lockdown by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India in March, 2020, the GSFians devoted themselves to work for the Direct & Indirect Victims of COVID-19 and Lockdown thereof under the Banner HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19. Under HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 Control rooms were established in Patna Bihar, Srinagar J&K and Delhi NCR so that needs of frontline workers, stranded passengers, students, labourers and COVID-19 patients & their attendants could be met with.

Donation in Cash & Kind from individual philanthropists, Corporate & Business Houses under CSR was received and the support in the form of

- Safety Gear Equipments viz; PPE Kits, Gloves, Masks, Sanitizers, Face Shields were provided to Front Line Warriors (Doctors, Paramedic Staff, Police & Paramilitary personnel, Sanitation Staff & Volunteers) irrespective of any kind of bias.
- Cooked Meals / Dry Ration to Daily Earners, Stranded Passengers, Students, Labourers and COVID-19 Patients & their attendants.
- COVID Specific Medicines & Medical Equipments like X-Ray Machines, Oxygen Concentrators, Oxygen Cylinders etc Supplied to Hospitals .

The HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 operations were carried out in the states of J&K, Delhi-NCR, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha and approximately 45000 households were given Dry Ration Kits. Also Safety Gear Equipments in bulk were handed over to about 07 Hospitals including PMCH Patna, MCCH Anantnag J&K, MMG District Hospital Ghaziabad, SDH Achabal Anantnag etc and now to Sadar Hospital Araria. A Portable X-Ray Machine *“Allenger, Model: MARS 4.2, Assure Version-7, Type: HF X-Ray, Rad Mobile”* was donated to Super Speciality Paediatric Hospital & Post Graduate Teaching Institute Sector-30 Noida for patient care in view of crises created by COVID-19. Ten (10) Oxygen Concentrators were donated to Sub District Hospital Achabal Anantnag J&K in 2021 (COVID-19 2nd Wave) for supporting COVID-19 Patients.

Executive Summary of the Project

All of us are well aware of the havoc created by COVID-19 in India. The situation created by COVID -19 especially 2nd Wave in India was totally unexpected and therefore everything cannot be left for Government. Time has come when Non Government Organization(s), Corporate House(s), Business House(s) and individual(s) should come forward and take every possible step in helping the Nation overcome this challenge.

Being a Non Profit Organization, Grameen Sneh Foundation (GSF) is already on War against COVID-19 & its effects as mentioned above. GSF is on war against COVID-19 and its effects since March 2020 under the banner HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19.

The crisis created by COVID-19 in 2021 (2nd Wave) are different and more challenging than that of 2020. Considering the severity of the situation and challenges posed by COVID-19 (2nd Wave), GSFians modified the support approach and resorted to support the direct & indirect victims by multiple means viz;

- By providing medicines
- By Providing Devices & Equipments to Hospitals
- By Providing Safety Gear to Frontline Warriors
- By Providing Dry Ration Kits to Daily Earners, Stranded Laborers, Students, Attendants of COVID-19 Patients and the like needy ones.

The efforts made by Frontline Workers (especially Medical Fraternity), steps taken by Government and the will power to conquer the Pandemic shown by Public in general has finally decreased the intensity of COVID-19 (2nd Wave) but the damage (Loss of Life) created by COVID-19 (2nd Wave) is irreparable. The decreasing trend of COVID-19 never means that it is the time to relax because there is still a long battle to fight against it. The increased intensity followed by a downfall just because of the mutating nature of the Virus and shows its wave nature so far we have seen Wave - I in 2020 and Wave - II recently. As per the reports released by National and International Health Authorities including WHO, AIIMS and the like, the possibility of COVID-19 III Wave cannot be ruled out. In fact COVID-19 III Wave has already hit some countries. Based on the data and observations some health specialists including Epidemiologist and Virologists are of the opinion that Pediatric Population will be worst hit by COVID-19 III Wave. COVID-19 (especially 2nd Wave) has cost India heavily and further loss of life due to pandemic has to be prevented if not altogether at least we have to minimize it as much as we can.

Since SBI Foundation has already supported GSF's HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 during COVID-19 Wave-I in Srinagar District of J&K, therefore GSF once again approached SBI Foundation for financial support of HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 in Araria District of Bihar.

WHY ARARIA?

Why Araria District of Bihar? Araria district is one of the thirty-eight districts of Bihar and Araria town is the administrative headquarter of this district. Araria district is a part of Purnea division. The district occupies an area of 2830 sq km. This district has total 2 sub-divisions namely Araria and Forbesganj and 9 blocks. Economy of Araria district mainly depends on agriculture. Main agricultural produces of this district are paddy, maize and

jute. The overall work participation rate is 40.3 percent, which is much less in case of the female population. Agriculture workers dominate the labour force, and the proportion (64.7% of the total) is almost double the national average. Most of the villages lack basic infrastructure: 92 percent are without any medical facilities; 20 percent are without any formal facilities of education of any type; 597 ii out of 713 villages are without electricity; and 50 percent of the villages are without all weather roads. The Annual Per Capita Income of Araria is merely Rs 5262/- (Source: A BASELINE SURVEY OF MINORITY CONCENTRATION DISTRICTS OF INDIA Araria (Bihar) Sponsored by Ministry of Minority Affairs Government of India and Indian Council of Social Science Research) According to the 2011 census Araria district has a population of 28,11,569. The district has a population density of 993 inhabitants per square kilometre. Its population growth rate over the decade 2001-2011 was 30 %. Araria has a sex ratio of 921 females for every 1000 males and a literacy rate of 53.53%. In 2006 the Indian government named Araria one of the country's 250 most backward districts. It is one of the 38 districts in Bihar receiving funds from the Backward Regions Grant Fund Programme (BRGF). This showery district of north-eastern Bihar is one of the most backward districts of Bihar, standing at the bottom of the 90 minority concentration districts. Owing to its backwardness and poor infrastructural health, educational and other facilities NITI Aayog, Government of India has included Araria district in the list of Aspirational Districts for the purpose of fostering developmental activities. As per the report "Aspirational Districts Baseline Ranking March 2018" published by NITI Aayog regarding Baseline Ranking of 101 Aspirational Districts using latest available data collected from the respective ministries, NITI Aayog ranks Araria at Sr. No. 91 with a score of 30.16 thereby making Araria district land among the poor performers.

Since SBI Foundation has supported GSF's HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 in Srinagar District of Jammu & Kashmir in 2020, therefore GSF once again approaches SBI Foundation for financial support of HAUSLA RAHAT COVID-19 in Araria District of Bihar.

HAUSLA RAHAT Campaign received overwhelming response from masses. The dedicated team of GSF volunteers worked very hard to reach out to the needy ones and help them by any means. Despite many challenges GSFians materialized the project and concluded it efficiently on a good note because ***"where there is will there is a way"***. The entire project was completed in several phases viz; Identification of Vulnerable Beneficiaries followed by Procurement of Dry Ration Items followed by Kit Preparation & Distribution, Liaisoning with Sadar Hospital Araria, Procurement of COVID-19 specific Medicines & Devices / Equipments and Safety Gear.

As GSF team stepped out for identification process, the response was beyond expectations and the message spread like a wild across Araria district and people started approaching GSFians personally and telephonically as well. Since the quota was very limited as compared to the demand so GSF adopted priority criteria and priority was given to daily earners like foot path vendors, hawkers, construction labours, street vendors etc.

Owing to the limited resources GSF could not reach out to all the needy ones but still managed to distribute **1632** Dry Ration Kits as compared to **1600** approved by SBI Foundation (**Details of the Beneficiaries are enclosed**)

Sadar Hospital Araria was provided with all the Safety Gear and COVID-19 Specific Medicines, COVID-19 Specific Devices & Equipments in presence of Officers / Officials from SBI Main Branch Araria and Civil Surgeon Sadar Hospital Araria and Media Fraternity.

Challenges Faced on the Field

Grameen Sneh Foundation(GSF) has a well spun network of volunteers in every chapter. So far as the distribution of Dry ration Packets in Araria is concerned it is not wrong to say that it was a Challenging Job for the entire team of GSF. Although GSF is used to undertake tedious tasks but the one being discussed was not only tedious but challenging too. Identification of vulnerable beneficiaries was the most difficult task. The procurement of items was comparatively easy but kit preparation was very tedious. Since every kit contained more than 11 items of which 07 items were to be weighed accurately while as remaining were counted. The major challenges faced on ground were as follows:

- **Movements:** The restrictions imposed by lockdown challenged the free movement of GSF team. Although GSF had obtained Movement Passes from District Administration but still there were very hurdles in movement and GSF vehicles were frequently stopped for

showing Movement Passes. Somewhere road barricades and blockades were installed in such a way that we had to change our route thereby making the trip more expensive & time consuming. Sometimes in the worst cases GSF team walked on foot and reached the target beneficiaries.

- **Physical Distancing:** As per the guidelines issued by WHO, MoH&FW, Central / State Government and other organizations Physical Distancing is not only important in the prevention from COVID-19 but it has become a protocol now and practically maintaining Physical Distancing among masses on ground is very difficult and that too while Distribution is going on it seems next to impossible. People (vulnerable beneficiaries) throng and completely forget about all protocols. In order to avoid such happenings GSF sought support of district administration (police). Irony of the fact is that when police or GSF volunteers deal strictly the mob replies “*Sahab Aap Bhi Bacche Wale Hain, Bachoon Pe Taras Khao, Kuch Toh Dou*”, *Malik Jis Ka Mobile Nahi Un Ko Bhook Nahi Lagti Hai Kya*”, *Corona Se Darr Gaye Toh Khayain Ge Kya*” some replied by saying “*Bhaya 2 Din Se Khaya Nahi*”. Any way what we experienced on ground cannot be expressed in words.
- **High Demand for Dry Ration Kits:** Since there was approval for distribution of only 1600 Dry Ration Kits and additionally GSF distributed 32 Kits at its own cost but the demand for Dry Ration Kits was beyond expectations. The Demand was manifold as compared to the sanctioned strength of Dry Ration Kits. Considering the number of Dry Ration Kits to be distributed and the demand for of Dry Ration Kits, GSF decided to go for distribution of of Dry Ration Kits in 04 of the 06 Blocks of Araria Sub Division viz; Araria, Jokihat, Kursakanta and Raniganj. The Sub Division Forbesganj was totally left out. The Demand - Supply Gap was very big even in the selected 04 Blocks and therefore GSF had no option but to resort to identification and selection of the most deserving ones.

The process of identification and selection was very challenging and tedious, in fact it was not easy for GSFians because there were so many factors (*not to be mentioned here*) influencing the process. In short at the end of identification and selection process there was a mixed response i.e whoever were selected were all praise and whoever were not selected resorted to criticism and on ground GSFians have to go through all this.

- **Weather / Atmospheric Condition(s):** The Weather of Araria also posed some challenges because for being too hot and humid / moist, the food items procured were supposed to spoil. In order to avoid spoilage of food items GSFians resorted to phase-wise procurement. Whatever procurement was being done, immediately the Kits were

prepared and set out for distribution. There was no scope of storage of procured items. This phase-wise procurement added to the miseries of GSFians.

- **Healthcare Infrastructure:** One of the major challenges faced by GSFians on ground was Awareness. Public in general was not so aware about COVID-19 as they should have been. Irony of the fact is that even the Sadar Hospital Araria that was a designated / dedicated COVID-19 Hospital was not strictly as per the COVID-19 SOPs. The Staff of Sadar Hospital Araria were not seen strictly enforcing COVID-19 SOPs and not to speak of general public. The infrastructure of Sadar Hospital Araria was not enough to deal with high in-flow of COVID-19 patients and considering the gravity of situation GSF decided to donate Oxygen Concentrator to Sadar Hospital Araria in addition to the COVID-19 specific medicines, Devices & Equipments and Safety Gear as mentioned in the Grant Letter.

Learning from the Project

The learning(s) from this project could be categorized into positive(s) and negative(s). Although both positive and negative aspects give us a learning and increase our knowledge but the future strategy will be to repeat the positive aspects and not to repeat the negative aspects.

Since this project was limited to Araria district only therefore the major leaning from Araria is that people in general are jobless, unemployment is found everywhere COVID-19 has worsened the scenario, Healthcare sector is not at its best, although education is free but parents prefer their children to work than to care for their schooling. 93% population in Araria is rural and agriculture is practised by major chunk of population. Since entire agriculture in Araria is left at the mercy of nature for it is monsoon dependant therefore it cannot be taken as a reliable economic source. In times when monsoons are not in time the farmers are left with no option but migration to prevent the starvation of their families Although Government of Bihar and even Central Government has plans and schemes for upliftment and development but everything cannot be left out for Government(s). Time has come when Non Government Organizations, Corporate Houses and Industrialists should come forward for intervention so that developmental activities could be catalysed.

ETC Building SIRD Campus, Nongsder Ri Bhoi Meghalaya

Grameen Sneh Foundation collaborated with Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Government of India and State Government of Meghalaya (State Institute of Rural Development) for training 250 BPL youth across Meghalaya state with minimum assured placement @70% under the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Grameen Kaushal Yojna (DDU-GKY). The entire project is jointly sponsored by MoRD (90%) & State Government of Meghalaya (10%) and is initially valid for a period of 03 years.



After finalization of all the required official formalities post Project Approval Committee (PAC) Approval, GSF entered into a legal MoU with the DDU-GKY State Office Meghalaya on 26th Feb, 2021. On behalf of DDU-GKY State Office Meghalaya on 26th Feb, 2021 the MoU was signed by Madam S R Marak, State Programme Director, DDU-GKY Meghalaya and witnessed by Mr J C Lohani, Chief Operating Officer DDU-GKY Meghalaya while as on behalf of GSF the MoU was signed by Mr. Inamul Haq Rafiqi, Chief Executive Officer, GSF and witnessed by Mr. Prabhakar Vishnu, Executive Director, GSF.

The project is purely residential therefore in order to training, boarding & lodging arrangements for the candidates GSF rented a lush green campus in a very eco friendly environment comprising of three (03) storey three (03) buildings from Extension Training Centre (ETC), State Institute of Rural Development, Government of Meghalaya with a large compound, outdoor games area and a terrace lawn in the Nongsder village of Umsning Block in Ri Bhoi District Meghalaya. Since the possession of campus was a pre requisite for the MoU, therefore the possession of campus was done before MoU and the legal formalities (rent agreement) was made well in advance on 22nd Feb, 2021 between Madam Kong Emby, Principal, ETC Nongsder and witnessed by Mr J C Lohani, Chief Operating Officer DDU-GKY Meghalaya while as on behalf of GSF the MoU was signed by Mr. Inamul Haq Rafiqi, Chief Executive Officer, GSF and witnessed by Mr. Prabhakar Vishnu, Executive Director, GSF.

Immediately after taking over the possession of the rented campus GSF started the renovation and repair (Painting, Plumbing, Electric , Landscaping & other) work in the campus. Parallel to it the hiring of staff was started and initially Mobilizers were hired in March, 2021 for carrying out the Mobilization work. As per the DDU-GKY SOPs GSF was supposed to start the Due Diligence done by May, 2021 and that is why the repair and renovation work was going on at full pace but unfortunately due to onset of COVID-19 (2nd Wave) and lockdown thereof by Meghalaya State Government everything was put in limbo upto Mid September when the state government partially relaxed the COVID-19 restrictions.

Soon after the partial relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions GSF swung back into action completed the pending renovation and repair works, hired all the required staff and equipped the centre and hostels (both boys & girls) with all the necessary infrastructure as prescribed in the DDU-GKY Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). The campus was now ready for Due Diligence (DD) and the physical DD was done on 12th October, 2021 by Mr. Donald Jyrwa, State Programme Manager. Meanwhile the Khasi, Garo and Jaintia Mobilizers had mobilized candidates for the training. Finally on 18th October, 2021 the DD was



Approved.

Immediately after the DD was approved GSF gave a nod to the mobilizers for admitting the students who had been waiting long.
