- 4. Bihar; Ek Virasat is largest online heritage library on Bihar (www.biharekvirasat.com), who promotes the cultural legacy of Bihar. This website was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Justice of Patna High Court in the auspicious presence of Chief Election Officer, Bihar; Secretary to Hon'ble CM of Bihar and several distinguish guests from the city. Apart from above, more than 500 cancer survivors, students from various colleges, doctors, Government servants, NGOs and important dignitaries graced the occasion.
- 5. Bihar in eastern India is one of the oldest inhabited places in the world with a history going back 3000 years. The rich culture and heritage of Bihar is evident from the innumerable ancient monuments that are dotted all over the state. Bihar is home to many tourist attractions and is visited by large numbers of tourists from all over the world. Around total 6 million tourists visit Bihar every year.
- 6. Bihar is rich in culture and heritage. The ancient city of Bihar boasts of some very rich and treasured sites of ancient India. The state of Bihar houses some very exquisite heritage sites from the ancient history of India, which speak volumes for its glorious past. Some of the heritage sites here dates back to the times of Ramayana and Mahabharata. The remains of Rajgir are the oldest architectural remains after the Harappa and Mohanjodaro remains in India. Bodhgaya is home to the tree where Buddha got enlightened. There is temple in Bodhgaya, constructed by Ashoka, in memoir of Buddha. Nalanda is home to the sites of the ancient Buddhist International University. Vaishali is the place where Ashoka made the famous lion-pillar. Vaishali is very holy place for the Buddhists. Be it the Hindu Pilgrimages sites, the Buddhist monasteries or the ancient Jain sites, Bihar is one most treasured destination in India with numerous places of interest. Bihari is the western group of Eastern Indic languages, spoken in Bihar and neighboring states in India. Angika, Bajjika, Bhojpuri, Magahi, and Maithili are spoken in Nepal as well. The Angika, Bajjika, Bhojpuri, Magahi and Maithili speaking population form more than 21% of Nepalese population. Despite the large number of speakers of these languages, they have not been constitutionally recognized in India, except Maithili, which gained constitutional status via the 92nd amendment to the Constitution of India, of 2003 (gaining assent in 2004). Even in Bihar, Hindi is the language used for educational and official matters. These languages were legally absorbed under the overarching label Hindi in the 1961 Census. Such state and national politics are creating conditions for language endangerments. After independence Hindi was given the sole official status through the Bihar Official Language Act, 1950. Hindi was displaced as the sole official language of Bihar in 1981, when Urdu was accorded the status of the second official language. In this struggle between Hindi and Urdu, the claims of the three large native languages of the region - Magahi, Bhojpuri and Maithili were ignored.

- 7. The purpose of slogan "Bihar; Ek Virasat" is to campaign for awareness about our heritage legacy around the world in general and Biharis, in particular. Bihar; Ek Virasat is an initiative to promote the culture, tradition and everlasting heritage of the State of Bihar to foster and strengthen cultural relations, understandings and awareness between Bihar and other regions. It aims to promote cultural exchanges with other regions and states as also to develop relations internationally. Bihar; Ek Virasat is largest online heritage library on Bihar (www.biharekvirasat.com), which promotes the cultural legacy of Bihar.
- 8. In this programme, students from different schools/colleges have participated. The competition was an ideal platform for the young minds to showcase their talent and provided an opportunity to get acquainted with the rich culture of their own district/comissionary. Bihar; EK Virasat Essay, Painting and Folk Dance Competitions for School Children, organized by Grameen Sneh Foundation, Bihar Chapter. The winners get a certificate, medals and consolation prizes too.
- 10. Following points consider while announce the winners -
- Relevance of the theme depicting the topic.
- Execution of concept/theme.
- Overall visual appeal, handling of given space and use of appropriate colour combination.
- · Handwriting quality.


The jury selected the winners in painting – junior, painting – senior, essay writing in Hindi and essay writing in English in the order of merit.

Folk Dance – A group folk dance competition organized, with regard to the traditional folk culture of each commissionary. Each artist has been given 10 minutes for their performance and 5 minutes for the stage arrangement. Judgment done on the basis of dance movement and steps, technical aspects of choreography, acting part, attire, direction and its overall affect.

The dance performance centered on local language/traditional folk culture of district within a commissionary. Improvisation, fusion and other filmy experiments is completely prohibited. The dance should either be of primitive nature or of the folk style. Classical dance form and dance drama will not be considered valid. Use of tape, cassettes or film songs in prohibited. 

Bihar; EK Virasat Kala & Film Mahotsav is a better platform to rise voice over child related issues and children's film and their impact on society - She replied the question concerning why UNICEF in Kala & Film Mahotsav? We can bring social change through empowering. The film should be screened in the village, where the children are hungry and helpless. Bihar has the highest number of children who are not children exactly; they have to grow up in childhood and seem to bear expenses of family and household. In every five minutes one newborn child died in Bihar, every two hours one mother died during childbirth also. Children's childhood has been killed, childhood is not lost.

"Children even their parents are really bothered after watching a horror movie and in most cases start believing

in the stories. Children are psychologically affected and even after parents assuring them about such things don't exist, they seem to believe in the scary characters of the movie. In many cases children are known to fall sick or even suffer severe health problems after watching such horror movies." Mr. Vineet Kumar said during panel discussion.

"It is entirely on parents to observe on what and which movie their child should really watch depending upon its positive and negative effect on the child's mind."

# DAY 02 | 17.02.2017 SPECIAL IN-CONVERSATION:

Mr. Simiyu Barasa said that now-a-days children of young age group easily pick up the punch lines or dialogues of their favorite hero and speak confidently in front of others. Parents find it a very proud moment when their child narrates such dialogue in front of others, but if such thing is limited up to just saying in front of others than its okay. What if the child starts to do more than that? With violent movies children are exposed to some unwelcoming ideas including murders, abuse, suicides, arrogance, rudeness, and stealing, cruelty and doing mean things for accomplishing goals in life. The persuasive ability of actors in movies are conquering the minds and hearts of children by this unsuspected weapon, children grow up watching families being destroyed and children disrespecting their parents, and irresponsible parents ruining the lives of their children in the films.

According to Mr. Charles Thomson impact depends on the type of movie and type of society. Movies are mirror of society like any other art. A positive movie can have a negative impact and vice versa. For instance, what a child wears is based on what is being seen weaned in a particular film, how the people in that film behaves is how the child will behave or what he or she says depend on what the child hears in the film. **Impact of films on Children and Society;** 


Need for meaningful cinema for children, about children and by children and adolescents.




